INTERESTING CASE- 1

MAMMOTH MASS: A SURGICAL CHALLENGE

Chief complaints :

A 32-year-old lady, with no prior conception, presented with complaints of heavy menstrual bleeding gradually progressing over one year, associated with passage of clots and dysmenorrhea which was absent prior to the present year. Moreover, the patient noticed a painless mass per abdomen, insidious and gradually growing over the past six months, presenting as a gravid womb, with a history of significant weight loss over the year. The patient had a significant past history of undergoing an abdominal myomectomy, removing approximately 2kg uterine fibroid ten years ago, and was corrected for anemia post-surgery. There is also a family history of the mother undergoing hysterectomy at 30 years of age. This insidious onset of a growing mass per abdomen with a history of sudden weight loss warrants attention.

On confirmation of examination findings, a firm abdomino-pelvic mass arising from the pelvis corresponding to a 36-week gestation gravid uterine size was confirmed.



The USG abdomen-pelvis showed a bulky uterus with evidence of a large abdominal-pelvic heterogeneous multi-lobulated solid lesion likely arising from the anterior wall of the uterus, measuring 29 x 10.4 x 17cm in size. The lesion is seen extending superiorly till the epigastrium with evidence of internal and peripheral vascularity, with the posterior myometrium well-preserved and endometrial thickness measuring 7.4mm. This confirms a diagnosis of a mammoth-sized fibroid uterus comprising multiple fibroids.

Laboratory findings of optimum hematocrit levels, normal liver function and renal function tests, and slightly deranged coagulation profile led to the following treatment modalities based on the patient's age, severity of symptoms, desire for future fertility, size of the fibroids, significant past history, and patient's preference:




- Medical management with two doses of INJ Leuprolide three months apart was advised.
- Surgical management included myomectomy or hysterectomy.



The patient was followed up after three months and planned for surgical management with myomectomy, considering the patient's young age, symptoms, desire to retain menstrual function and fertility. Surgical challenges expected included a large uterine fibroid, adhesion, massive hemorrhage, distorted uterine anatomy, uterine reconstruction, need for hysterectomy, trauma to bladder, ureter, and bowel, and recurrence of fibroid and persistence of symptoms.

Adequate precautions were taken preoperatively, as the patient had taken oral iron supplements for 3 months and additionally received preoperative GnRH to decrease the size and vascularity of the fibroid.

The patient underwent ABDOMINAL MYOMECTOMY with multiple fibroids, approximately 25 different sizes of myomas were resected and removed, weighing around 3.2kg with THE LARGEST MEASURING 15 X 10 CM, with a total blood loss approximating two litres. Intraoperatively, blood loss was controlled by applying hemostat tourniquets through the broad ligament, and adequate blood transfusions were done intraoperative and postoperative period.



****Postoperative period**** was uneventful, with the histopathology report suggestive of features consistent with "Multiple leiomyoma".

Postoperatively, the patient received 2 doses of Gonadotrophin-releasing hormones one month apart. She was advised to plan for conception after 4-6 months following myomectomy for better restoration of anatomy and wound healing. An elective cesarean section was planned on conception at 37 completed weeks of pregnancy due to the breach of the endometrial cavity during the procedure.

CASE REPORT: A STORY OF MY-OMA TO MY-BOMMA

Hereby presenting an interesting case of a patient who presented in December 2023 with a married life of 3 years, complaining of pain abdomen and severe dysmenorrhea, and was anxious to conceive, in Akash Hospital. After examination and evaluation, she was found to have a mass of 6 x 6 cm with features consistent with a right lateral wall uterine fibroid with mild lateral deviation of the right pelvic ureter.







The patient underwent abdominal myomectomy (removal of the fibroid mass) successfully on 05/12/2022, was put on GnRH analogs for the following 3 months, and was advised to conceive thereafter. In May 2023, the patient tested positive for a pregnancy test following two months of amenorrhea. She was followed up until term and underwent a successful cesarean section post-myomectomy surgery and delivered a term baby in Akash Hospital. Hence, thereby adding another feather to the cap of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, offering a successful delivery post-removal of fibroid, thereby impacting women through challenges of infertility.



INTERESTING CASE- 3

Case Report: The Scare of the scar

Hereby presenting a case report of a 27-year-old multigravida woman with a previous 1 LSCS done 2 years back due to fetal distress, presenting with ?11 weeks gestation by date (?wrong dates) with bleeding per vagina associated with clots since two weeks in our hospital's emergency department. The patient had a history of taking MTP pills (OTC) 5 days ago and had bleeding per vagina. On examination, she was vitally stable, with tenderness in the lower abdomen on per abdominal examination, and a bulky uterus with cervical os admitting tip of finger with clots present on per vaginal examination. Ultrasound revealed thickened endometrium 22mm. Dilatation and evacuation was done, and post that, a scan was done to confirm retained products of conception, which revealed no products of conception but a mass of 2.2cm suggestive of fibroid and advised for review scan for better characterization of the mass.

Three weeks post-evacuation, the patient again presented with pain abdomen, bleeding per vagina, and passage of clots on and off. Vitals were stable. Urine pregnancy test was faintly positive, hence beta hcg was done and found to be 4140 mIU/ml. Repeat USG suggested a 4cm heterogeneous lesion at utero cervical junction anteriorly with regular cystic areas with significant peripheral vascularity suggestive of ectopic pregnancy/ RPOC/hemorrhagic degeneration of fibroid. The patient was advised for MRI, which was done, consequently suggesting Heterogeneous signal intensity lesion with evidence of blood products at the site of cesarean section scar – to consider scar ectopic pregnancy. The patient underwent hysterolaparoscopy.

Hysteroscopic finding revealed a rent defect measuring ~ 3 x 4 cm on the right anterolateral wall approximately near the scar area, and few products of conception were removed under hysteroscopic guidance, but complete evacuation was not achieved. Hence the procedure was converted to laparotomy. After opening the abdominal cavity, an unruptured scar ectopic measuring ~ 3 x 4 cm was noted more towards the right side on the previous scar. Intramyometrial vasopressin was injected, the scar was excised, and products of conception were scooped out completely followed by re-suturing of the remnant uterine wall. The patient was stabilized post-operative period. Products of conception were sent for HPE and were suggestive of products of conception.

Thereby acknowledging the collective team effort of the department of obstetrics and gynecology, radiology, and anesthesiology for timely intervention and prompt diagnosis which immensely steered the patient out of a life-threatening complication of scar ectopic rupture.

FACULTY SENSITIZATION PROGRAM IN AKASH CENTRE FOR ADVANCED SIMULATION


